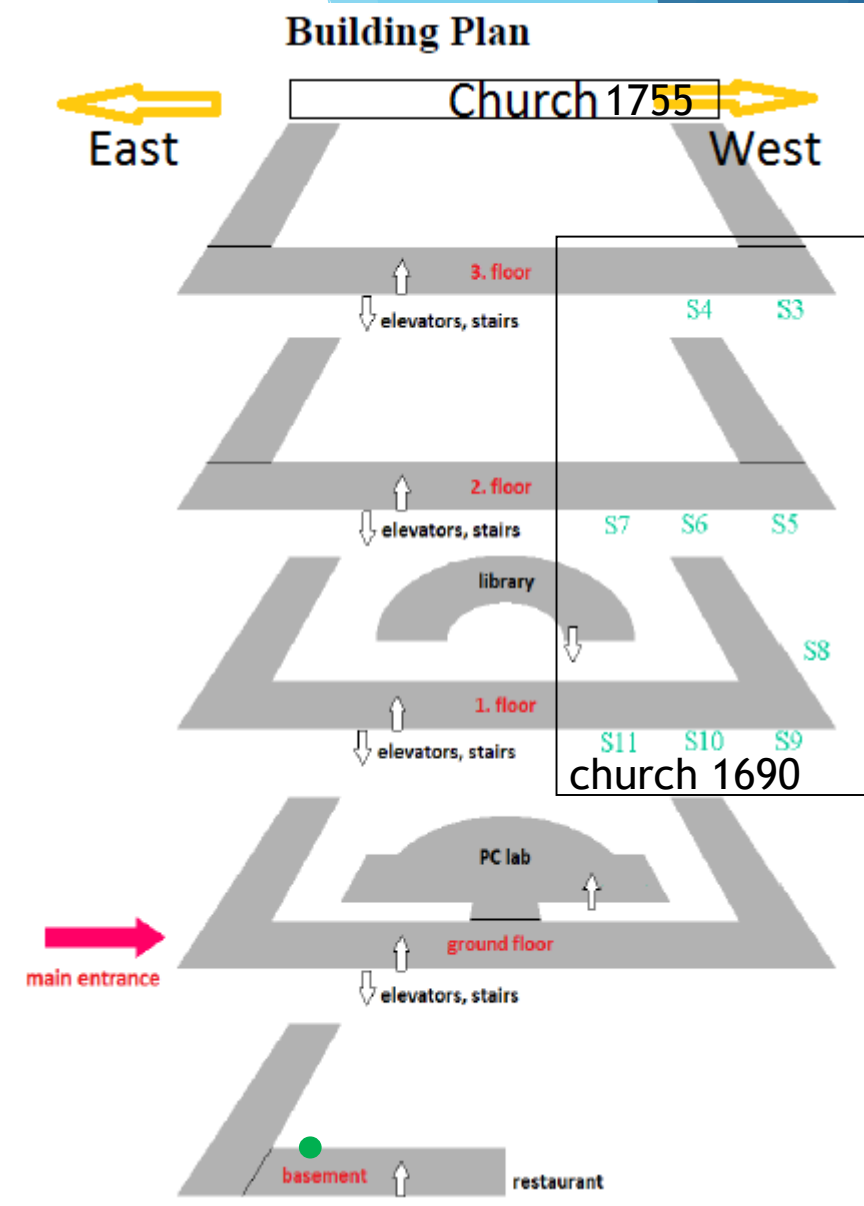

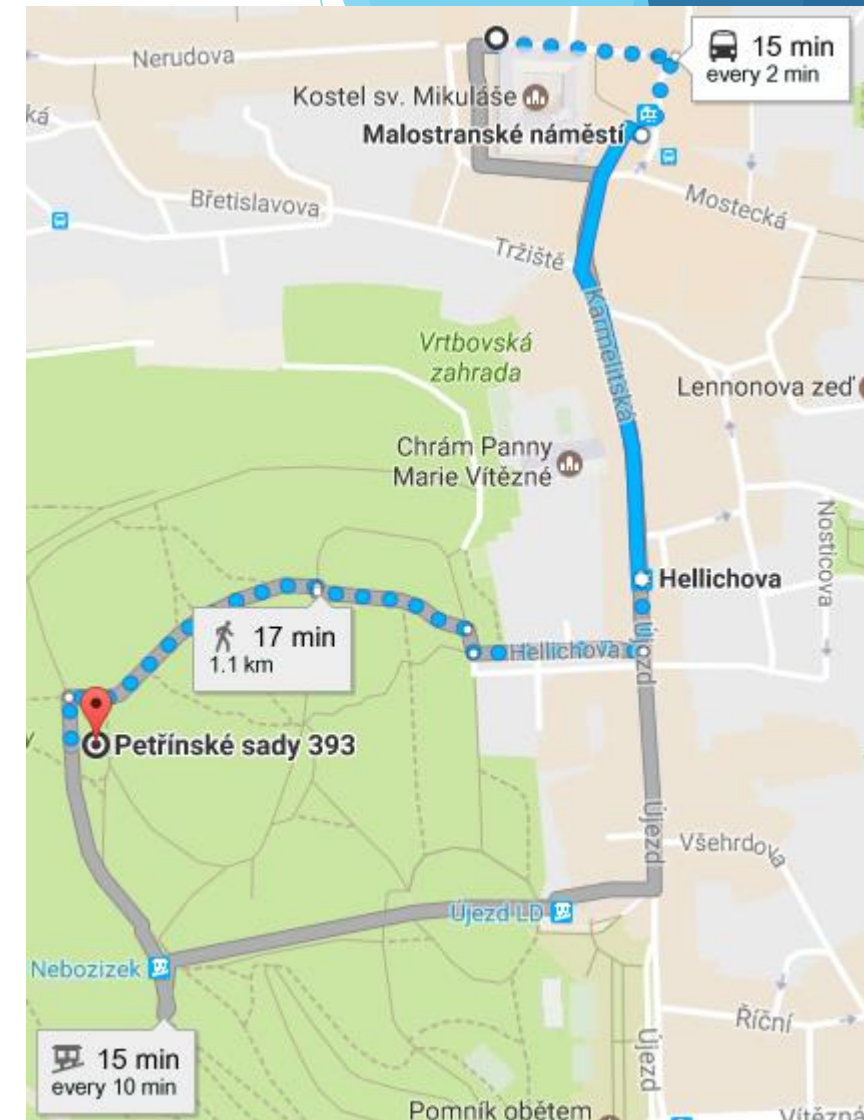
- ▶ Conference Lectures are situated mostly in the 1st floor of the building, room S4 for Tutorials is located in the 3rd floor.

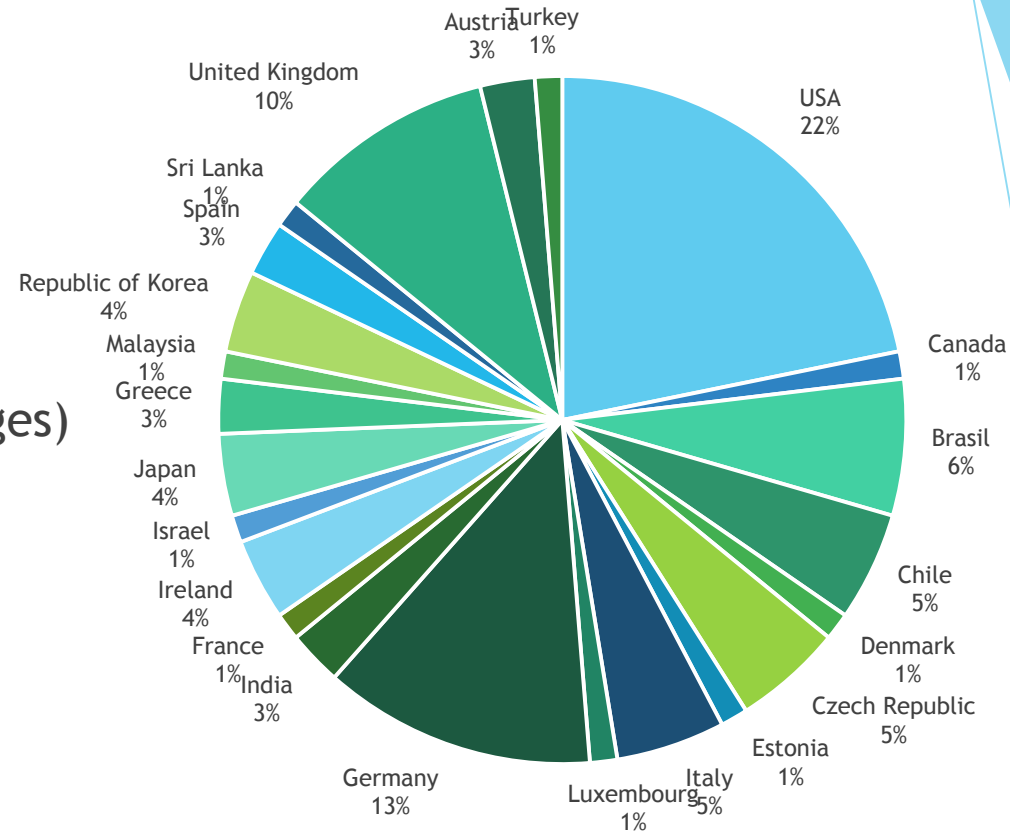
